At Forum 2.0, we learned about how our incoming Upper Schoolers will experience a fresh, research-based take on high school—rich in thematic, interdisciplinary learning that merges math and science with the liberal arts. Within our walls, problem-solving and real-world leadership will govern the classroom, the playing field, and an awesome internship and entrepreneurial program. And in chapel

and religion classes, our spiritual education core will infuse the school day with the focus on faith so vital to life at St. Francis.

Tying it all together will be the same *people for others* culture that has always made the St. Francis community so special. Our students send Valentines to troops overseas, sing carols at assisted-living facilities, prepare thousands of sandwiches and care kits for Houston's homeless, and deliver school supplies in person to children in Costa Rica. All across our Primary, Lower, Middle, and (soon!) Upper Schools, St. Francis is a family that will always believe that *bold giving* is every bit as important as *bold learning* and *living*.

he 2016–17 school year was best characterized by one word: *growth*. Growth in our enrollment, expansion of our facilities, and the promise of our Upper School. The leadership of St. Francis continues to carefully weigh opportunities for

investment and believes each improvement we make positions our school to better serve the families, faculty, and students that make up our community. Each of these enhancements is only possible because of the commitment made to St. Francis by our families and benefactors.

Following are highlights from a year of progress, promise, and change:

- St. Francis welcomed a record 900-plus students back to school in August 2016.
- On October 13, we held a groundbreaking ceremony for the Crum Athletics Center—a welcome South Campus expansion facility for our Middle School sports program, as well as home to future Upper School classrooms and athletics teams.
- The Middle School Travel Program hosted new adventures to the Grand Canyon, Bryce Canyon, and Zion National Parks, as well as Spain—in addition to its longstanding trips to Washington, DC/Colonial Williamsburg, and Monteverde, Costa Rica.
- In January 2017, St. Francis hosted an Upper School symposium attended by teachers and leaders from universities and independent schools across the nation for a day of discussion on best practices and protocols in 21st century education.
- Proceeds from the 2017 St. Francis Gala funded initiatives across our campuses, including upgrades to our Primary School outdoor playscape, core reading/writing and math training for 15 Lower and Middle School faculty members, training for a certified campus therapy

dog, and partnership in the Caring Schools program with the Harvard Graduate School of Education.

- St. Francis conducted an international search for the department chairs who will shape the curriculum and serve as the founding faculty for the St. Francis Upper School.
- On April 25, Forum on the Future 2.0 laid out our vision for the Upper School as never before, including a sample school day schedule, specifics on core programs, athletics details, and an introduction to the full slate of Upper School design team members.
- Our new Primary School cottages saw their first full year of use. What an amazing addition to our campus and programming they have proven to be!



I am confident that all of these accomplishments, as well as many not highlighted here, position us to move forward stronger and ready for the challenges and opportunities to come. Your board of trustees is committed to the mission of St. Francis, and we continue to strive for excellence while maintaining our core roots. I feel blessed to step into the future along with the warm, giving, and growing St. Francis community.






Athletics, Down to a "T."

Having grown up the son of a coach, with fields, gyms, and locker rooms as playgrounds, T. Riley knew from a very early age that he wanted to pursue a career in athletics. "My father, who spent nearly 40 years as an NFL and college coach, helped his players become better on and off the field," he says. "He showed a true care for them as athletes and as people, and he was able to build long-lasting relationships along the way."

Mr. Riley comes to St. Francis after spending 12 years at St. John's School in roles including assistant athletic director, head baseball coach, and PE teacher. When asked why he chose St. Francis, he remarks, "It was the opportunity to be a part of something so unique and challenging. I want to help build something from the ground up; there are so many exciting firsts that will happen over the next few years, and I am really looking forward to being a part of that."

Mr. Riley explains that, throughout his career, his favorite memories involve the lasting relationships he has formed with former players. He says the one thing he hopes they graduate knowing is that it is always best to prepare, play, and compete the right way. He wants his players to take pride in doing the little things great—as they add up to bigger things—and to be the best they can be each day.

As far as advice for young or aspiring athletes? *Enjoy your time playing high school sports.* "Many students' playing careers will end after grade 12, so these four years can be some of the best and most memorable years in your life," he concludes. "Work hard, compete the right way, listen to and respect your coaches, be a great teammate, and have fun."



FACULTY MILESTONES



Middle School teacher and mentor David Smithwick retires after 30 years in the classroom—and receives a send-off worthy of the cream of the crop.

Award-winning educator. Devoted history enthusiast.

Remarkable role model. For 30 years, David Smithwick really has been the apple of our eye in the St. Francis Middle School. How fitting, then, that in his final days before retirement, the veteran American history teacher was honored by a surprise visit from KHOU 11 News reporter Cristina Kooker, who presented him with the Star Furniture Red Apple Award. The distinction, which recognizes deserving educators in southeast Texas who are making a difference in the lives of children, culminated the colorful career of this former antiques dealer who turned to the classroom to share his love for a world gone by with the generations of the future.

"When a student comes back to St. Francis, the one person they are looking to see is Mr. Smithwick," remarked Incoming Head of School Stephen Lovejoy. "He's had an impact on so many kids' lives—it goes beyond anything we can say." Maybe it's how Mr. Smithwick strived to bring a working knowledge of history to students through his frequent travel to historical landmarks across the country. Or how his lessons were enhanced by his earlier roles teaching

Texas history, American literature, Latin American studies, and geography to our seventh and eighth graders. *Or maybe it was the neckties.* Mr. Smithwick recalls that, in an effort to make lessons more interesting, he started wearing the most outrageous ties he could find. He ended up with about 400 of the eye-popping accessories—99 percent of which were gifts from students happy to join in on the joke.

Twice nominated as U.S. History Teacher of the Year by the Lady Washington Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Mr. Smithwick has also been recognized as an Outstanding History Teacher by the Texas State Historical Association. As he becomes part of the history of St. Francis, he leaves behind a lasting legacy of dedication, global perspective, the power of humor, and some final words of advice: "Always question, investigate, and come up with your own ideas."

There's no questioning the fact that we appreciate Mr. Smithwick for his years of service and the incredible influence he's had on the lives of our students!

Why not visit the heralded Hawai'i Preparatory Academy Energy Lab, a top student-centric research and collaborative education facility? The first zero-energy, -water, and -waste school building in the world, the Energy Lab offered our St. Francis educator a direct view into efforts to create a healthier planet. This knowledge will, in turn, inspire our students to calculate volume and conversions, collect data, and graph solutions for energy-efficient models worthy of Hawaii's sunny shores.

Honoring a Middle School curriculum rich in the grand works of Shakespeare, Dickens, and Chaucer, teachers Carol Bedard and Morrie Bogrand traveled to England to "reincarnate" these literary giants. Ask Technology/Math Specialist Holly Plost how to motivate kids to (gasp!) enjoy math, and she'll tell you it's all in their *mindset*. Fueled by Dr. Carol Dweck's research-based model supporting the potential of a "growth mindset" versus the stagnation of a "fixed mindset"—St. Francis has worked to encourage a growth mindset among faculty, staff, and students for a number of years. This past summer, Mrs. Plost headed to Stanford University for a two-day workshop on "Teaching Mindset Mathematics" led by Dr. Jo Boaler, a Stanford mathematics professor, researcher, and author. The event highlighted the role mindset plays in determining success and failure, with an emphasis on helping students embrace challenge as an opportunity to learn and improve, rather than avoiding it due to potential failure. Mrs. Plost previously facilitated a campus book study covering Dr. Boaler's book, Mathematical Mindsets, and returned from Stanford armed with further research for teaching mindset resiliency in math and beyond!

2017 Outstanding Volunteer Award:

Brandi Marrus



When looking at schools for her two children, Brandi Marrus knew she wanted them to learn in a nurturing, faith-based environment. When she discovered St. Francis, she found this and so much more. Over a period of eight years, this community would become a home to her and her family. They would make friends, share life experiences, and become stronger in their faith. From lessons and recitals to volunteering and chapel services, life at St. Francis was never dull—and Brandi says it's shaped her family through a myriad of memories.

would be the perfect way to spend time with students and explore a lifelong interest. She was right. "Some of my most memorable moments at St. Francis were products of my involvement around campus," she says. A particularly satisfying moment was when the eighth graders were able to recall all of the lessons they had learned throughout their years in Art à la Carte. She also fondly recalls presenting the faculty with their end-of-year gifts as part of the Parents Association Board.

"I learned a long time ago that if you want to make a difference in your child's life, you have to be involved as much as you can."

It wasn't long after the Marrus family joined St. Francis that Brandi saw how involved parents were and knew she wanted to get in on the action. As president of the Parents Association, she learned just how much the organization influences campus life each day. From planning experiential learning events to funding vital extracurricular programs to hosting the Spring Luncheon and other parent enrichment activities, Brandi feels fortunate that she was able to contribute to such an important part of the community. "My love for my children, plus the fact that I had time to do it, was what motivated me to get through those doors every day," she remarks. "The opportunities I had to interact with administration, teaching faculty, and students were invaluable."

In addition to her work with the Parents Association, Brandi also looked for ways to get involved inside the classroom. Having grown up with an artist for a mother, she guessed that becoming an Art à la Carte docent While it was her love for her children and the blessing of time that spurred Brandi to give so generously of herself to St. Francis, she says it was the chance to become involved and interact with faculty and staff that cemented her commitment. And now that both of her children are in high school, they realize the significance of also having been cradled by faith during their St. Francis years. She points out that they miss having that virtue-driven culture as part of their daily school lives.

When asked what *she* will miss most about our school, Brandi reflects, "St. Francis was where my children grew up and became young adults. It will always be the place where they ran to me at the end of the day and threw their arms around me when they were young, where they learned how to make friends—and how it hurts to lose them—and where they realized what it was to be a teammate and to put God first."

2017 Outstanding Volunteer Award:
Stephanie Willinger



When Stephanie Willinger recalls her time at St. Francis, her favorite memories center on those moments when she glimpsed the powerful potential within students. She says these were opportunities that could have only existed in an environment that truly fosters the holistic development of children—and it was the same environment that cultivated a spirit of giving in her own daughter, Piper Willinger `17. Just as Piper was led to volunteer monthly with Montrose Street Reach, participate in mission trips, and give of her time when victims of Hurricane Harvey were in need,

growing up, Stephanie admits it took time for her to realize the importance of team sports. Through her daughter's participation, though, she became aware of the countless advantages—from boosts in self-confidence to lessons about healthy competition to simply easing the often bumpy road that is a Middle School social life. She affirms that the vibrant athletics program at St. Francis certainly contributed to Piper's overall growth and credits her success as an athlete, in large part, to the caliber of coaching and competition at St. Francis, all supported by the Booster Club.

mom Stephanie's years at St. Francis were defined by service in a community that truly advances its mission to be *people for others*.

Stephanie was originally struck by how much St. Francis encourages parental involvement. When considering how she could give of her time, the former Sotheby's New York employee and self-described "artsy kid" was naturally drawn to our Friends of Fine Arts (FoFA) and Art à la Carte programs. As FoFA treasurer and Art à la Carte docent, Stephanie relished the act of sharing her passion and held dear the impact that art had on students—the light in children's eyes upon seeing their artwork displayed in the People Place Gallery or realizing there was, in fact, an artist among them to be explored and celebrated.

A calling that may not have been as clear, at least initially, was how involved Stephanie would become with the Athletics Booster Club—which she describes as the hardest-working group of women she's met. Not an athlete

Contributing to a community that encourages students in their faith, challenges them in the classroom, and inspires them to pursue their dreams was of paramount importance to Stephanie when selecting her family's school community. After finding her checklist complete at St. Francis, the sense of camaraderie between faculty and families further encouraged her to become involved. But it was ultimately the expectation from St. Francis that students be *people for others* that made her dedication a done deal. "I think to truly be a person for others, you first have to be comfortable with the person you are, have confidence in your voice, and feel safe taking what might seem like a risk," she muses. "Whether it is stepping outside your comfort zone to help a stranger in need, supporting a friend, or standing up to a bully, St. Francis has given my daughter the tools to help her on her path to becoming a person for others, and I am eternally grateful."


Are there any St. Francis events you remember with special fondness?

Yes! The Blessing of the Animals was always an excuse to bring my pets to school. Those were always good memories.


I remember you being a very shy, quiet girl and that your confidence developed a lot more over the school year. Do you remember what brought that out in you?
